It could be filled with chocolates, sweets or a small treat and given as a gift or party favour. It is also ideal for charity fundraising.

## Materials

Double knitting wool in beige and dark brown

Knitting needles size 3¼mm (UK size 10)

Sewing needle

Good quality washable toy stuffing

## Abbreviations

**K** Knit

**P** Purl

**st(s)** Stitch(es)

**beg** Beginning

**tog** Together

**m1** Make one stitch by picking up the horizontal loop before next stitch and knitting into the back of it

**inc1** Increase one by knitting into the front and back of the stitch

**dec** Decrease by knitting two stitches together

**K2tog** Knit two stitches together

**P2tog** Purl two stitches together

**sl** Slip 1 stitch (stitch is passed from the left needle to the right needle without being knitted, slip purl-wise)

**pssso** Pass slip stitch over (pass the slipped stitch over the knit stitch and off the needle)

**st-st** Stocking stitch (1 row knit, 1 row purl)

**B & T** Break yarn, leaving a long end. Thread through remaining stitches on needle, draw up tightly and fasten off.

## What will yours be?



To make a *cuddly toy*, work a gathering thread through the cast on stitches, stuff body, draw up tightly and fasten off. To make a *finger puppet* simply leave the cast on edge open. Alternatively you can thread some thin elastic through the cast on stitches to enable your toy to be easily opened and closed when containing a *treat!*

## Embroidered stitches



Thread sewing needle with yarn and knot end of yarn. Take needle through the stuffed toy and bring it out at the position required. Pull yarn to draw the knotted end right inside the stuffing. Now work the embroidered stitches. Insert the needle back into the toy at the same place and bring the needle point back up at the opposite end of the stitch. Loop the yarn around the needle and pull the needle through. Repeat the procedure to make a row of chain stitches.

## Twisted cords

To make a twisted cord, cut a strand of yarn four times as long as the measurement required. Knot one end round a door knob, chair leg or hook and knot a loop in the other end to fit around the index finger of your right hand. Now keeping the yarn taught, twist your finger round and round in a clockwise direction. Keep twisting until when relaxed, the strand of yarn begins to curl back on itself. Fold cord at centre, bringing ends together. Allow yarn to twist tightly and knot ends.



## Rows worked in double yarn

There are occasions where one or more rows are worked using double yarn, changing back to a single strand of yarn for subsequent rows. When changing from double to single yarn, treat the two loops on each stitch on the previous row as one stitch when working the next row.

## Working in stripes

When knitting different coloured stripes, carry yarns up side of work.

## Toy safety

These characters have been designed for young children, so please ensure that attached pieces are sewn on very securely and seams are tightly finished off. If a twisted cord is tied in a bow, sew through bow so that it can not be undone if pulled. Use only new, hygienic, washable stuffing that conforms to current safety standards.

# Puppy

## Body and head

With beige cast on 22 sts

**Row 1** K4, (inc1, K3) 4 times, K2 (26 sts)

**Row 2** Purl

**Row 3** K4, (m1, K6) 3 times, m1, K4 (30 sts)

**Rows 4 - 18** Beg with a P row, st-st 15 rows

**Row 19** K6, K2tog, K14, K2tog, K6 (28 sts)

**Row 20** Purl

**Row 21** K6, K2tog, K12, K2tog, K6 (26 sts)

**Rows 22 - 24** Beg with a P row, st-st 3 rows

**Row 25** *Shape head row*

K4, (m1, K6) 3 times, m1, K4 (30 sts)

**Rows 26 - 34** Beg with a P row, st-st 9 rows

**Row 35** K6, K2tog, K14, K2tog, K6 (28 sts)

**Row 36** Purl

**Row 37** K5, sl1, K1, pssso, K2tog, K10, sl1, K1, pssso, K2tog, K5 (24 sts)

**Row 38** Purl

**Row 39** K4, sl1, K1, pssso, K2tog, K8, sl1, K1, pssso, K2tog, K4 (20 sts)

**Row 40** Purl

**Row 41** K3, sl1, K1, pssso, K2tog, K6, sl1, K1, pssso, K2tog, K3 (16 sts)

**Row 42** Purl

**Row 43** K2tog to end (8 sts) B & T



## Snout

With beige cast on 6 sts

**Row 1** Inc1, K3, Inc1, K1 (8 sts)

**Rows 2 - 8** Beg with a P row, st-st 7 rows

**Row 9** K1, K2tog, K2, K2tog, K1 (6 sts) B&T

## Ears (make two)

With beige cast on 3 sts (*top of ear*)

**Row 1** Knit

**Row 2** Purl

**Row 3** Inc1, K2 (4 sts)

**Row 4** Purl

**Row 5** K2, inc1, K1 (5 sts)

**Row 6** Purl

**Row 7** Inc1, K4 (6 sts)

**Row 8** Purl

**Row 9** K4, inc1, K1 (7 sts)

**Rows 10 - 14** Beg with a P row, st-st 5 rows

**Row 15** K1, K2tog, K1, K2tog, K1 (5 sts)

**Rows 16 - 18** Beg with a P row, st-st 3 rows

**Row 19** K1, inc1, K1, inc1, K1 (7 sts)

**Rows 20 - 24** Beg with a P row, st-st 5 rows

**Row 25** K2tog, K5 (6 sts)

**Row 26** Purl

**Row 27** K4, K2tog (5 sts)

**Row 28** Purl

**Row 29** K2tog, K3 (4 sts) B&T

With right side of st-st outside, fold ear in half at row 17 and oversew the side edges together. One side of the ear is slightly longer than the other, to allow the ear to be neatly sewn onto the puppy's head.

## Fore Legs (make two)

With beige cast on 8 sts

**Row 1** (Inc1, K1) 4 times (12 sts)

**Rows 2 - 4** Beg with a P row, st-st 3 rows

**Row 5** K1, (K2tog) 2 times, K2, (K2tog) 2 times, K1 (8 sts)

**Rows 6 - 8** Beg with a P row, st-st 3 rows

**Row 9** K3, K2tog, K3 (7 sts)

**Rows 10 - 14** Beg with a P row, st-st 5 rows

**Row 15** K2tog, K3, sl1, K1, pssso (5 sts)

**Row 16** Purl B&T

With right side of st-st outside, oversew the side edges and the cast on stitches together. Stuff lightly.

## Hind Legs (make two)

With beige cast on 6 sts

**Row 1** (Inc1) 5 times, K1 (11 sts)

**Row 2** Purl

**Row 3** K5, inc1, K5 (12 sts)

**Rows 4 - 6** Beg with a P row, st-st 3 rows

**Row 7** K4, (K2tog) 2 times, K4 (10 sts)

**Rows 8 - 13** Beg with a P row, st-st 6 rows  
B&T

Work a gathering thread through the cast on stitches and draw up. Join the side edges together and turn right side out. Stuff lightly. Using dark brown embroider paw pads, as illustrated.

## Tail

With beige cast on 6 sts

**Rows 1 - 2** Beg with a K row, st-st 2 rows

**Row 3** K2tog, K4 (5 sts)

**Row 4** Purl

**Row 5** K3, K2tog (4 sts)

**Row 6** Purl

**Row 7** K2tog, K2 (3 sts)

**Row 8** Purl

**Row 9** K1, K2tog (2 sts) B&T

With right side of st-st outside, oversew the side edges.

## To Make Up

Sew seams and join pieces using mattress stitch. Join the side edges of the puppy, working down from gathered top of head. Leave cast on edge open and turn right side out. To make the head, work a gathering thread through every stitch on *shape head row*, draw up and stuff head. See instructions for '[What will yours be?](#)'

Position and sew on the ears and snout. With dark brown yarn embroider eyes, a nose and mouth. Pin the hind legs in position and adjust to make sure the puppy sits properly, then sew in place with a few stitches near the gathered top edge. Position and sew on the fore legs and tail.
